Consider the anatomy and physiology of the voice by following the voice from the lungs to the lips. The breath stream, referred to as the “ generator ” of the voice, originates in the lungs. This generator provides a controlled flow of air which powers the vocal folds by setting them into motion.

Vocal folds vibrate, changing air pressure to sound waves producing “voiced sound,” frequently described as a “buzzy sound”Varies pitch of sound. Resonating system. Vocal tract: throat (pharynx), oral cavity, nasal passages. Changes the “buzzy sound” into a person’s recognizable voice. Key Function of the Voice Box.

Voice Anatomy & Physiology

The complex anatomy of the vocal folds is designed to produce smooth, even vibrations which will sound pleasant and not hoarse. The epithelium is the outermost layer of the vocal folds. It is thin and moist and resembles the lining on the inside of your cheek.

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At the rear of the larynx on each side, each vocal fold is attached to a small arytenoid cartilage. Many small muscles also attach to the arytenoids. These muscles contract or relax during the various stages of breathing, swallowing, and speaking, and their action is vital to the normal function of the larynx.
