Research has shown that the sound of nails on a chalk board can be annoying because of the frequency or pitch of the sound - "the frequencies that contribute most to the annoyingness of the scraping sound are on the low end of the frequency range that our ear is most sensitive to." (page 50) Ear preservation is one hypothesis to explain why the screech makes us cringe - "a sensible way to protect our hearing is to evolve an aversion to sounds that are damaging." (page 51).
