Guidelines For Documentation Of Occupational Therapy

Documentation is necessary whenever professional services are provided to a client. Each occupational therapy client has a client record maintained as a permanent file. The record is maintained in a professional and legal fashion (i.e., organized, legible, concise, clear, accurate, complete, current, grammatically correct, and objective).

Physical and Occupational Therapy Documentation

Occupational therapy practitioners are held accountable for their services in schools, and documentation provides a trail of data that supports it. When documentation provides quantitative data, an education team can determine the significance of a problem and monitor change with instruction or intervention.
